



Péter Darák is the President of the Curia of Hungary and professor of financial law at the Faculty of Law of Eötvös Lóránd University in Budapest. He received his dr. jur. degree at the Faculty of Law of Janus Pannonius University in Pécs in 1987 and earned a PhD degree in 2007. From 1987 to 1990 he worked at the Prosecutor's Office in the town of Zalaegerszeg, from 1990 as a prosecutor dealing with civil matters and general supervision. From 1991 to 1999 he worked as a judge at Zalaegerszeg Town Court, hearing civil and administrative cases. From 1999 to 2012 he was a judge of the Administrative Division of the Supreme Court (later renamed as Curia). In 2002 he worked as a judge temporarily assigned to the Civil Law Department of the Ministry of Justice of Hungary. Since 2012 he has been the President of the Curia. He is, among others, Chair of the National Association of Administrative Judges, Representative of the Curia of Hungary at the EU Forum of Judges for the Environment, Chair of the Public and Administrative Law Department of the Association of Hungarian Lawyers, Secretary to Deák Ferenc Prize Board, member of the editorial board of the journal of Law-State-Policy and member of the International Association of Tax Judges. He has widely published, among others, in the field of financial law, tax law, constitutional law, competition law. He has been actively engaged in university teaching and research for almost twenty years.
